Unit: Part 1 My World	Title: What's in My Toolbox?

Knowledge, Content and Skills: Students will be able to: Identify interests and personal achievements that give meaning to their lives. Recognize different types of learning preferences and know how they prefer to learn. Identify decision-making styles and learn how to make thoughtful decisions.

Performance objective: To explain the differences in learning preferences, and to describe decision-making styles and the steps in good decision making. Use the seven steps to the thoughtful decision-making process and draw a diagram detailing the steps.

Estimated time: 2 hrs. Number of students: 10-15

Task analysis or activities: Students will complete answers to the Chapter questions. Make sure students understand the vocabulary listed under "Important Words." Allow time for the activities: On the Trail of, .com and Being the First Choice in class.

Evaluation: Students will be graded on their use of time, safety methods, quality of work, cleaning and organization of their work area, interaction with other students, and employability skills, grading rubrics for the Chapter Check projects.
