Establish a career plan by setting a timeline of career goals.

Performance objective: To evaluate career options and establish career goals. Chapter Check page 108-109, Interview people who have jobs and people who have a career, locate the Occupational Outlook Handbook, research careers to perform a verbal role play.

Task analysis or activities: Students will complete answers to the Chapter questions. Make sure students understand the vocabulary listed under "Important Words." Allow time for the "Being the First Choice" activity to be completed in class.
