Indicators/Objectives	Students will be able to: Describe characteristics of the modern workplace and recognize the reasons people work. Identify qualities employers expect from employees. Describe elements of effective communication skills. Apply learning skills to acquire information, and apply knowledge to solve problems and make decisions. Identify techniques for managing time and resources.
Required Materials	Career Connections One Trade Many Careers, pages: 40-65. Students should have internet access to do research.
Initiation (prior knowledge, connection, vocabulary)	To illustrate how personal beliefs and interests help identify career choices and how planning for the future makes career choices attainable.
Learning Procedures	Chapter Check page 64-65, Interview 5 people who have jobs, create a team building activity for a struggling team, learn a new knot using an online source to research knots.
Grouping	Whole group
Guided Practice	To explain the motivations for working and the skills and behaviors required to be successful in the workplace.
Instructional Strategies	Lecture and discussion on the reasons people have for working. Discuss good learning skills. Describe the techniques of problem solving. Review decision making. Engage students in the critical thinking questions.
Closure	Students will be graded on their use of time, safety methods, quality of work, cleaning and organization of their work area, interaction with other students, and employability skills.  Manipulative skills assessments and written evaluations.
